Hopefully this article will address the British Battles and Medals (7th Edition) which does not list the Welch Regiment under the 'No Clasp Medals' chapter.

The 1st Battalion, Welch Regiment arrived in Cairo from Durban on the 31st May 1886. In November 1888 B, D, E and F Companies under Lt Col McCausland were moved to Assouan as support against the Dervish raids upon the frontier posts between Wady Halfa and Assouan, withdrawing to Cairo on the 28th January 1889 without seeing any fighting.

The other half battalion consisting of A, C, G and H Companies under Major (brevet Lt Col) C.C. Smyth arrived at Suakin on 15th December 1888 and fought in the action at Gemaizah on the 20th December qualifying for the 'Gemaizah 1888' clasp. The two half battalions rejoined at Cairo in January 1889.

It is noted in the History of The Welch Regt that ...

'In the early part of 1889 there were persistent rumours that the Dervishers were meditating a strong attack along the west bank of the Nile. This menace developed at the end of April and beginning of May. On 1st July the Dervish leader, Nejumi, crossed the frontier opposite Wady Halfa in strength. By 1st August the Dervishers had taken up a position at Toski, where they were watched by Colonel Wodehouse's flying column.

On the news of the crossing of the frontier, the Sirdar hastened to Assouan, and a mixed Brigade of British troops was ordered up river from Cairo. This Brigade was made up of 2/Royal Irish Rifles, 1/Welch, a squadron of 20th Hussars, a company of Mounted Infantry, and a portion of a Royal Artillery Battery. The Regiment left Cairo on 21st July, having been preceded by 'G' Company as Advance Guard on the 13th.

The Regiment moved to Assiout by rail, thence by river steamer to Assouan, whence it marched across the desert to Shellal, where it embarked on two steamers for passage up the river towards the second cataract.

The Sirdar had intended to await the arrival of this Brigade before taking action, but the opportunity came to fight, when no more than the Hussar squadron had arrived. On 3rd August the Sirdar won the important battle of Toski, the most severe blow that had yet fallen on Mahdism.

The 1/Welch were on the river when this action was fought, and when within 30 miles of the scene of operations a message was received saying that the campaign was at an end. By 21st August the Battalion was back in Cairo, leaving about a fortnight later for Malta.

All the officers, NCO's and men who were present at Gemaizah received the Egyptian Medal with bar 'Gemaizah 1888'; in addition they all received the Khedive's Star. This was a new pattern Star, in that it had no date on it as previous issues.

The Regimental M.I. Detachment (1 officer, 1 Sergeant, 2 Corporals, 1 Bugler, and 25 Privates) was fortunate enough to be just within the area for which the medal and star were awarded for the Toski operations; the medal, however, bore no bar. But as this detachment had been present at Gemaizah this award was practically of no effect.'

Army Order 5 of January 1890 authorised a medal without clasp to all troops employed on the Nile, at and south of Korosko, 3 August 1889. 'British Battles and Medals (7th Edition) does not list the Welch Regiment under the 'No Clasp Medals' chapter. Consulting the Medal Rolls for the Egypt Medal to the Welch Regiment shows that there were 18 no clasp medals awarded with the annotation 'Present at Korosko on 3.8.1889'. This roll was signed by the Colonel Commandant of the Mounted Infantry Division. The 54 men of the Mounted Infantry Contingent on this roll show 36 qualified for the Gemaizah clasp (with 1 deserted- no medal) and 18 no clasp medals.



He was the son of Enoch (carpenter) and Elizabeth Barnett, Staunton, Gloucestershire.
Baptised 29.9.1867.



Trade given as a plow boy he enlisted 5.6.1886 at Monmouth into the Welch Regt for 7 years Colours and 5 years Reserve service. Age: 18 years 9 months. Trade: Labourer. Fair complexion, grey eyes and fair hair.

Ranks: Private 3.6.1886; Lance Corporal 6.9.1889; Corporal 13.5.1890.

Units: Depot, Cardiff 5.6.1886; 2nd Bn Dublin 15.9.1886; HMS Crocodile to Egypt; 1st Bn 'C' Company 23.12.1886.

When the Battalion was split, he was sick in hospital in Cairo with Iritis from 25.10.1888 to 31.12.1888 so missed the deployment to Suakin and subsequent action at Gemaizah.

Present in the Nile Operations 1889 as Mounted Infantry qualifying for the 'Soudan Medal 1889 & Khedives Bronze Star'.

Transferred to 1st Class Army Reserve 3.6.1893 and discharged 2.6.1898.

Character: Regular habits. Good Conduct.

Served Egypt 23.12.1886 to 28.8.1889; Malta 29.8.1889 to 9.2.1893.

Campaigns: Operations on the Nile 1889.

Certificate of Education 4th Class 1.9.1886; 2nd Class 19.5.1890

Married 20.9.1894, Eliza Bray at the Parish Church, Staunton, Gloucester. Brought on Married Establishment 10.10.1894. Eliza died in March 1900. Remarried Bessie Ellen Smith in April 1902.

He became a Postman and resided in 1911 Oakridge, Stroud. His health deteriorated and he died in January 1913.
